



From the AA Archives: Namaste Group

Founded December 2018

The definition of Namaste: An ancient Sanskrit greeting still in everyday use in India and especially on the trail in the Nepal Himalaya.

The word is spoken with a slight bow and hands pressed together, palms touching and fingers pointing upwards, thumbs close to the chest. Translated roughly, it means "The Spirit within me salutes the Spirit in you"

Namaste started on Saturday, October 6, 2007 by Dave MacD., and David T. The meeting was held in the home of Dave MacD. This is a silent meditation meeting, based on the Eleventh Step.

As the Group grew, and thanks to one of the original members, Beth S. who did the leg work to find a new home, the group moved on Friday, November 28, 2008 to the Bell's Corners United Church, in the Shalom Room. Attendance at the meeting was slow at first, however it grew quickly as it was the only Alcoholics Ananymous Meditation meeting in Ottawa.

The format of the meeting was to open with the Serenity Prayer, a moment of silence, the AA Preamble, and then a reading from the Big Book, pages 86 – 88. Silent mediation would then follow for twenty minutes. After meditating, we would share, if we wished, what came up in our meditation. There was a collection for the Seventh, and the meeting was closed with the Responsibility Declaration, and the Lord's Prayer. Fellowship was followed up in the kitchen.

The Group's first General Service Representative (GSR) was David T.

Over time, attendance started to dwindle. Paying the rent for the Church was becoming difficult and Namaste was now down to three to four regulars in attendance.

It was decided to move instead of closing the meeting. On Friday, May 10, 2013, Namaste moved to the home of Sue B. The format remained the same; however meditation was now thirty minutes in length.

When the meeting originally moved to Sue's, there was a communication error with Intergroup, and they thought the meeting had closed. Namaste was removed from the website, and the meeting list.

The meeting was manageable for some time in Sue's home. When the communication error was realized, and Namaste was once again listed with Intergroup, attendance began to grow to the point that the meeting became too large. It was time to look for a new location.

As Friday evenings were no longer available at the new location, the meeting moved to St. Paul's Presbyterian Church on Wednesday, September 24, 2014. It now meets Wednesday's, at 7:15 pm. The format of the meeting remained the same, however approximately one year later, the Group started to offer the white chip, along with the New Comer's Kit. The Group was now also selling the Big Book. The meeting at this time had also grown to an average of 22 members in attendance. The Business meeting of the group is held every third Wednesday of the month, after the meeting. Namaste is now capable of financially supporting the General Service Office, Area 83, Intergroup, and District 62.

This is an Open Meditation Group and is welcome to everyone. There are currently both AA members, Al-Anon members, and those that just wish to meditate in attendance. We invite you to come and join us.
